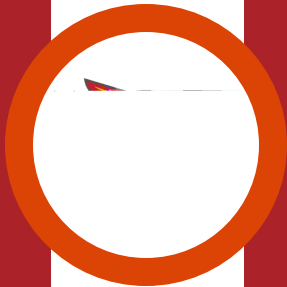


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Six Advanced Placement courses taught by Aiken County's highly qualified teachers during
