10-Point Uniform Grading Scale

This week, the State Board of Education unanimously approved a 10-Point Grading Scale for South Carolina high school students; Aiken County's Superintendent Dr. Sean Alford fully endorses the move.

"It provides a level playing field for South Carolina students as they compete for post-secondary opportunities with students from other states," Dr. Alford commented. "The move also aligns grading scales between public schools and most colleges and universities where students may be taking Dual Enrollment classes."
